Parents and teachers of newborns to pre-adolescents learn how to raise cooperative, responsible, and self-disciplined children. Topics include the pitfalls of punishments and rewards, the basic techniques of democratic discipline, and three reasons for inappropriate behavior. Students will learn how to change unwanted behavior by recognizing and meeting children's needs. Each participant will receive a complimentary copy of one of Aletha Solter's books.

Aletha Solter is a Swiss-American developmental psychologist, founder of the Aware Parenting Institute, and the author of five books for parents. She studied with Dr. Jean Piaget at the University of Geneva, Switzerland, where she earned a Master's degree in human biology. She also holds a Ph.D. in psychology from UC Santa Barbara. She has lectured in 17 countries and is recognized internationally as an expert on attachment, trauma, and non-punitive discipline. Her books, which have been translated into many languages, are: *The Aware Baby*, *Helping Young Children Flourish*, *Tears and Tantrums*, *Attachment Play*, and *Raising Drug-Free Kids*.
